

# 5. Strategic Guidelines

Mid Devon District Council intend for the strategic guidelines to feed into the formulation of specific landscape policies, and to be part of the evidence base for those policies in the Local Development Framework.

The strategic guidelines are organised in the following tables with related delivery mechanisms and each associated Landscape Character Type/s listed for that individual guideline.

To be compliant with the European Landscape Convention (ELC) the strategic guidelines are worded using the following:

protect: to protect what should be protected;

**manage:** to manage what needs management in order to be sustained; **plan:** to take strong forward-looking action to enhance, restore and create landscapes.
