

Types of Private Water Supplies

Type	Explanation
Large supplies and supplies to commercial or public premises (COMM)	These are private supplies which supply an average daily volume of 10m ³ (10,000 litres) or more or they supply water to premises where the water is used for a commercial or business activity or it is supplied to a public premises
Shared domestic supply (DOMS)	These are private supplies where the water is supplied to more than one domestic dwelling and there is no commercial or business activity
Single private domestic dwelling (SDDW)	These are private supplies where the water only supplies one domestic property and there is no commercial or business activity
Private distribution systems (PDS)	These are supplies where a person other than South West Water further distributes the water for human consumption. For example residential and holiday caravan sites, hospitals, etc

Risk Assessment (Each Risk Assessment)	£500	£190 plus sample analysis charge	We will undertake a risk assessment of all Private Water Supplies except for single private domestic dwellings. This will determine the parameters analysed during audit monitoring. Risk assessments will then be carried out every five years.
Sampling (Each visit)	£100	£75	Charge for a visit and to take a sample
Investigation (Each Investigation)	£100	£100	Carried out in the event of test failure.
Authorisation (Each Authorisation)	£100	£100	Application by the owner of a supply for permission to breach a standard temporarily whilst remedial work is carried out

Under Reg. 10 (Shared Domestic Supplies)	£25	Dependent on analysis parameters to be analysed	
Check Monitoring (Large supplies and supplies to commercial or public premises)	£100	Dependent on parameters to be analysed	This involves taking a sample that is analysed for a set list of bacteriological and chemical parameters
Audit Monitoring (Large supplies and supplies to commercial or public premises)	£500	Dependent on parameters to be analysed	This involves taking a sample that is analysed for specific bacteriological or chemical parameters not covered by check monitoring that might be present in the supply. These are determined by undertaking a risk assessment.
