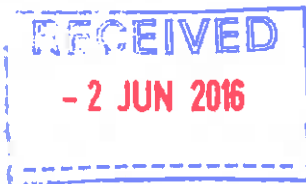
Thank you, for your communication regarding future planning. After some difficulty I have managed to examine documents S.C.I. and Refuse Storage S.P.O. I found the latter document most interesting, in so much as there now appears to be a statutory relation to the storage and disposal of various types of waste and how such receptacles should be stored and where they should be put for collection. This of course only relates to "new build" and all existing properties, have to make do, with where they store their receptacles.

Some properties like my own, which are about 50 years old, so relatively modern, have difficulty in obtaining such items. There is no easy way to get from the front to the back of the property except through the

inside. So, large bins etc cannot be used.  
It is not acceptable to store such items outside,  
the front of the property, which I hasten to add is  
owner occupied not social housing as it creates an  
untidy impression. On collection day there is no option  
but to put the receptacles out on the pavement for collection,  
as there are not even suitable to put the items in the  
back garden.

Hopefully, your new proposed strategy will solve a,  
problem, and will not be an "eyesore" for future residents.  
Also, I hope that you continue to make such documents  
available at the local library for inspection, as  
not all your residents are computer literate.
