



Safe, resilient and connected communities

In 2019 a survey of 8,875 people told us they would support more investment in preventing crime from happening and to keep our communities safe.

This year police officer numbers are increasing by 50 through local investment. This is on top of the additional 141 police officers our area will have received by the end of March 2021.



How will the money be spent?

- £1m to be focussed on preventing violent crime – such as domestic abuse, sexual violence and murder.
- More Blue Light collaboration – meaning extra officers working jointly for police, fire and ambulance services and other partners within your communities.
- Greater resilience for existing police enquiry offices.
- An examination to decide if the force's two call centres are sufficient to deal with the significant increases in demand with over 225,000 999 calls and 651,000 to 101.
- More money to help the Force deal with the welcome summer surge of people who visit Devon and Cornwall.
